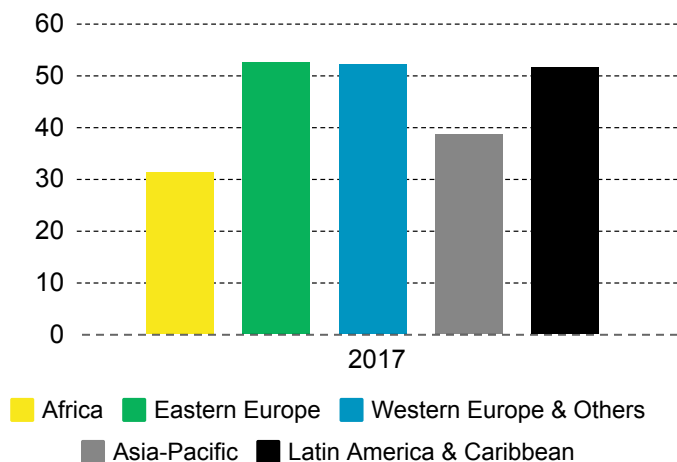
Women made up 42% of UNFCCC national delegations in Bonn May Session.

This shows no increase from the same conference in 2016.

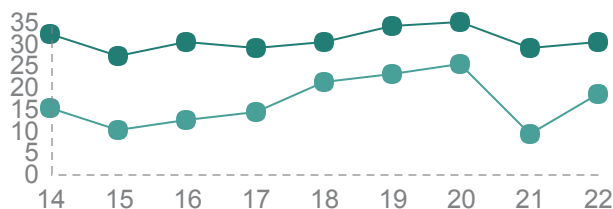
58 delegation heads were women, composing 31% of the 186 delegations.



% Women on National Delegations at Bonn in May 2017 by UN Region



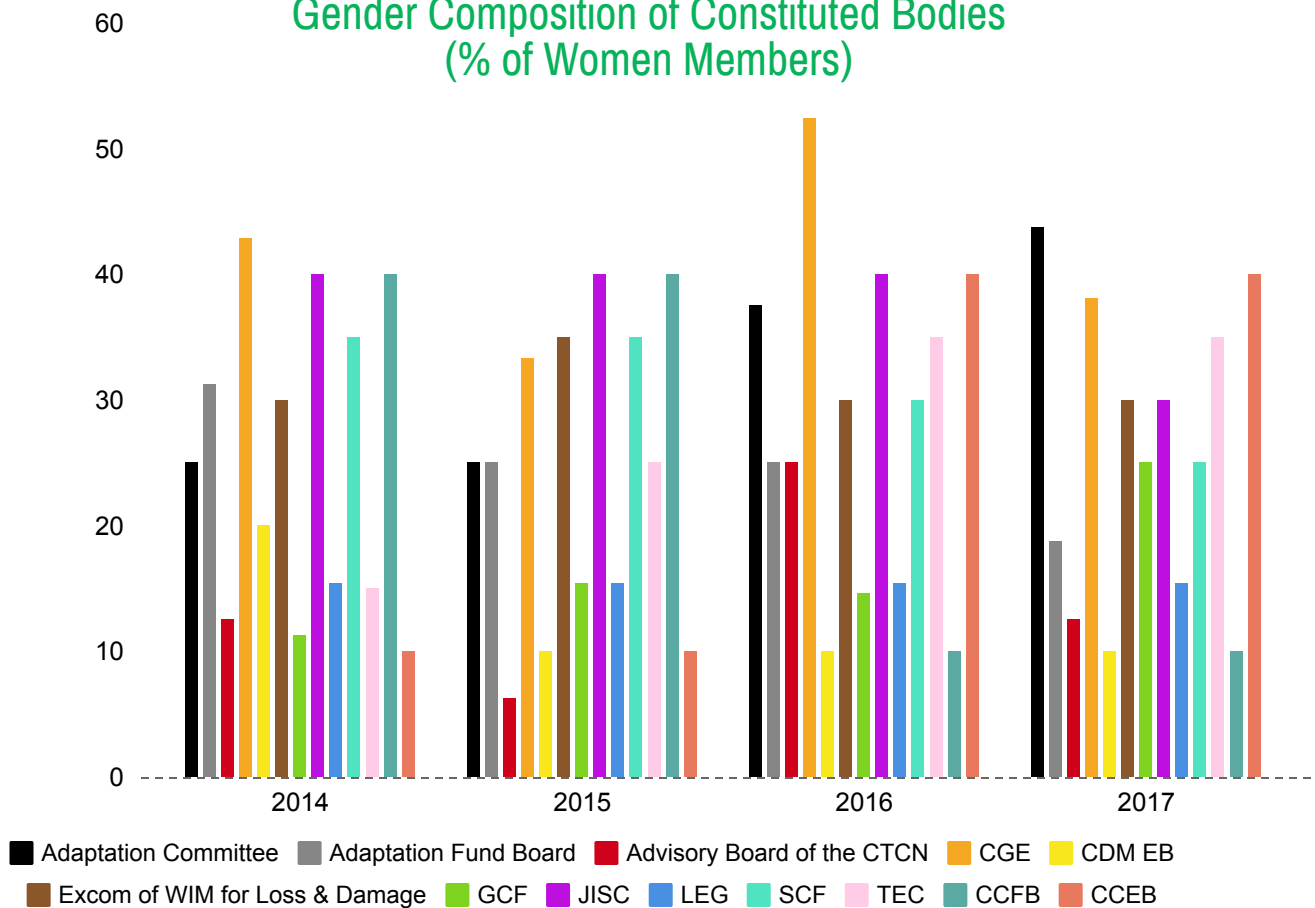
Women Participation at COPs

COPs have lower levels of women's participation than other UNFCCC conferences. On average, Women only accounted for 16% of Heads of Delegations to the UNFCCC, on average. In comparison, in 2008, women were on average just 15% of Delegation Heads. At this rate of change, gender parity will be achieved by 2040.
