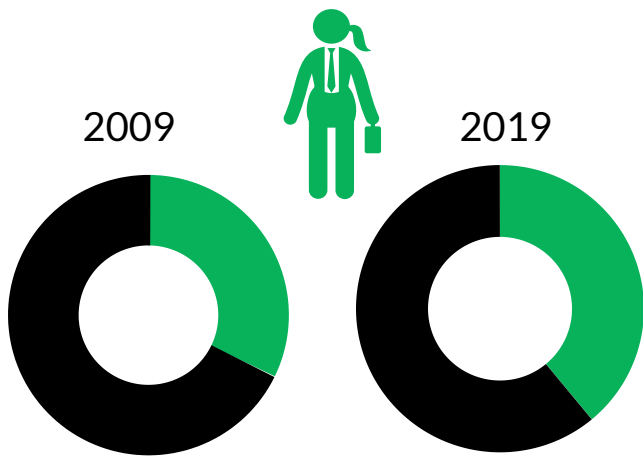

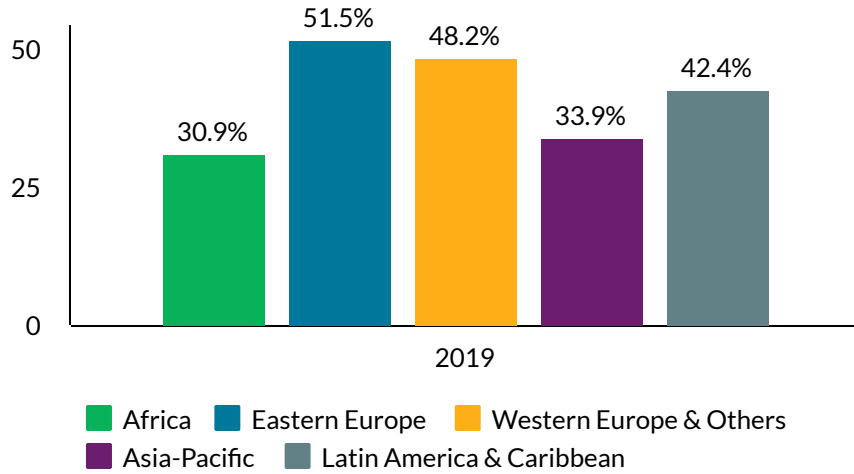
# UNFCCC: PROGRESS ON ACHIEVING GENDER BALANCE

REPORT: Women's Participation in the UNFCCC



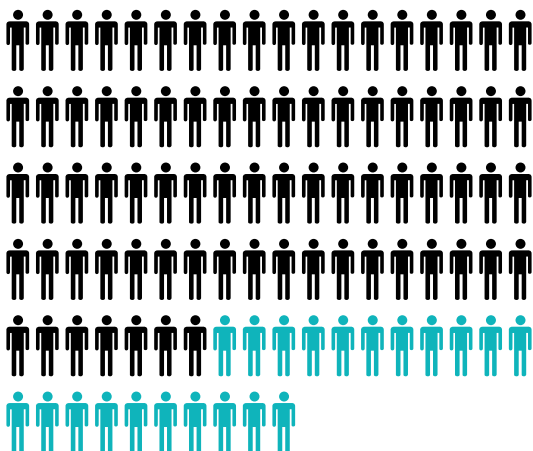
Women made up 39% of national delegations in 2019, compared to 32% in 2009.

### Percentage of Women on National Delegations in 2019 by Region



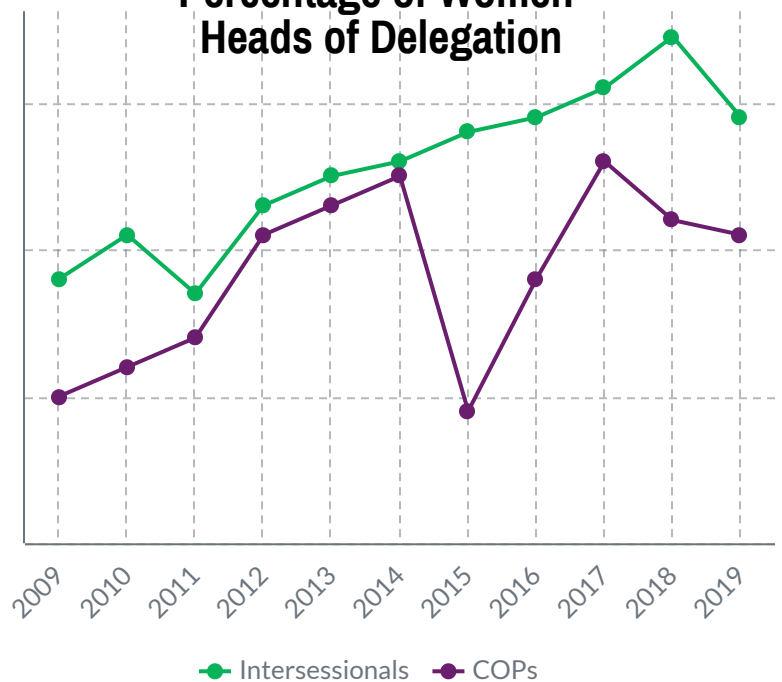
At COP15 in 2009, 19 of 193 Heads of Delegation (10%) were women.

At COP25 in 2019, 41 of 196 Heads of Delegation (21%) were women.



At this rate of change, gender parity for delegates will be achieved in 2046, but not until 2068 for COP Heads of Delegation.

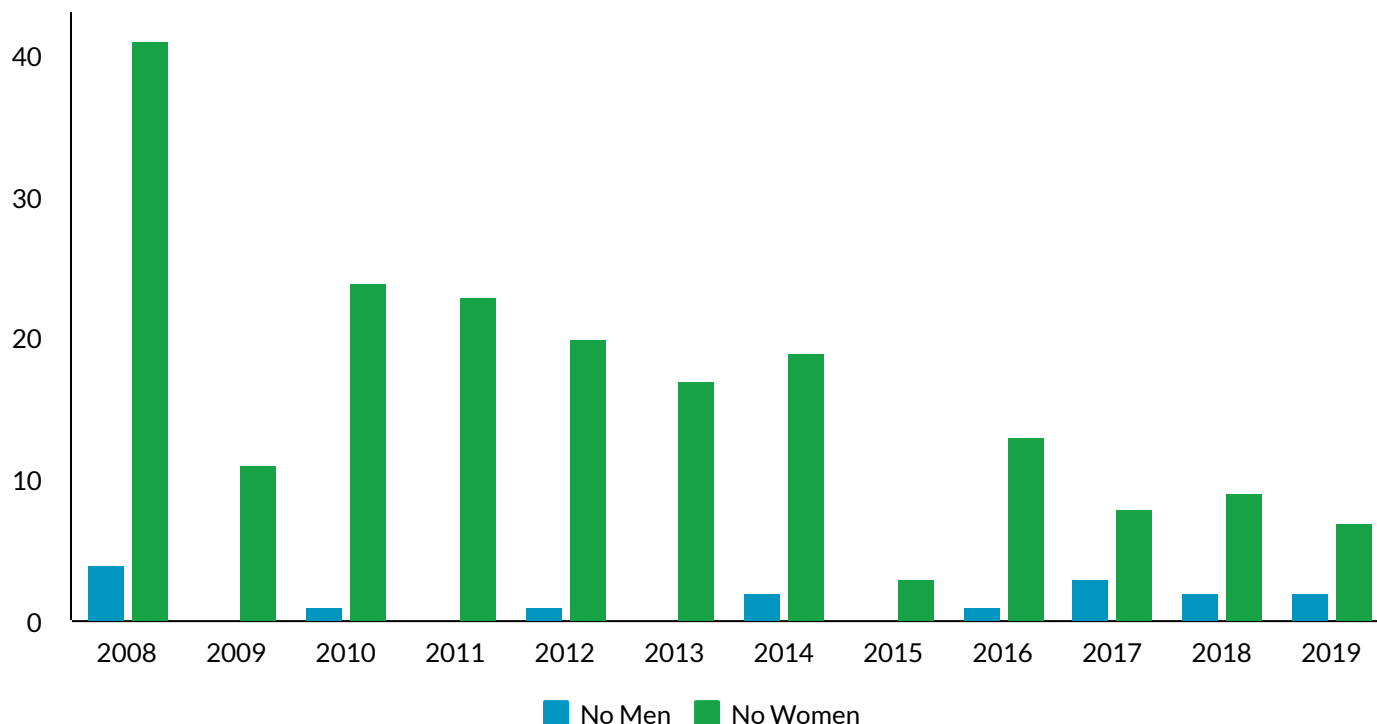
### Percentage of Women Heads of Delegation



Historically, COPs have lower levels of women's leadership than UNFCCC intersessional meetings.

## Gender Imbalance on Delegations

Number of COP delegations of two or more delegates with no representation from either women or men, compared to the most recent negotiations.



## Gender Balance on Delegations

Delegations with a total of 50% women and 50% men across the two negotiation sessions for the year
